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## Gov. Reynolds issues disaster proclamation including the Iowa Individual Assistance Grant Program and Iowa Disaster Case Advocacy program

Gov. Reynolds issued a disaster proclamation June 14<sup>th</sup> for two counties in response to severe storms on June 12<sup>th</sup> through 13<sup>th</sup> and continuing. The governor's proclamation activated the <u>lowa Individual Assistance Grant Program</u> (IIAGP) and the <u>lowa Disaster Case Advocacy</u> (IDCA) program.

West Central Community Action had 1 county declared a disaster including: Monona County.

The <u>Iowa Individual Assistance Grant Program (IIAGP)</u> may provide up to \$5,000 of assistance, reimbursement and/or vendor voucher, for covered items to households at or below 200% of the federal poverty level or a maximum annual income of \$51,640 for a family of three. Application must be made through your local community action office. You may be eligible for repair or replacement of items damaged by severe storms. Potential applicants have 45 days from the date of proclamation to submit a claim (July 29, 2024).

The <u>Iowa Disaster Case Advocacy (IDCA) program</u> is to address serious needs to overcome disaster-related hardship, injury or adverse conditions. Disaster case advocates work with clients to create a disaster recovery plan and provide guidance and referrals. There are no income eligibility requirement for Disaster Case Advocacy and there is no direct financial assistance provide by Disaster Case Advocacy. Disaster Case Advocacy closes 180 days from the disaster proclamation (December 11, 2024).

Additionally, individuals affected by the storms/flooding are encouraged to report their damage/losses to their county Emergency Management office.
